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## OVERVIEW

In order to familiarize you with the selection process of the charities in consideration for funding in 2020, we've put together this overview. This year we received 14 Belgian applications, 10 being eligible applications. Four applications were rejected; they were not eligible this year based on the criteria (see below). We received 45 International applications for funding. Some were rejected for the two-applications-per-country rule after careful assessment of all the eligible projects of the given country, and a few additional ones were not eligible based on the criteria stated in the application (see below) resulting in 25 eligible applications. The Charity Team and the Board spent many long hours reviewing every application to make sure each charity put before the members was qualified based on the voted upon selection criteria. First, the Charity Team made sure the application arrived by the due date and was complete. Second, the Charity Team reviewed each application based on the criteria stated in the application:

Factors taken into account when selecting charities for donation:

- The request should be for a specific project.
- The charity should be a non-profit organization officially registered (ASBL or VZW if located in Belgium) for at least one year.
- If benefiting organizations receive funds or authorization for funding for a project from the proceeds of a specific Bazaar, two complete calendar years for Belgian charities and three complete calendar years for International charities must pass from the date of that Bazaar, before the same organization may reapply to the NCB (for example, an International organization that has benefited from funds raised at the 2020 Bazaar can next apply in 2023).
- Application forms must be complete. All questions and requests for explanation should be addressed. If the question is not applicable to your organization, then write "Not Applicable."
- To be considered a Belgian charity, the organization must exist in Belgium.
- We are most interested in funding projects that are:
  - Small specific projects – preferably ones that can be completed with the set amount within a year.
  - Projects that cover the widest spectrum of the community.
  - Projects which, when completed should have a long-term impact and be of benefit to as many people as possible.
  - Projects benefiting NATO countries, NATO Partnership for Peace (PfP) countries, and countries where NATO is currently engaged – but without excluding projects from other geographic locations.
- Staff salaries and administration costs as a general rule are not supported.
- The maximum amount donated is **10.000 euros**.

After reviewing all the charities by the Board, the Charity Team put together the list of eligible candidates presented in two pre-briefing books e-mailed to members:

- **2020 Belgian Charities Pre-Briefing Book,**
- **2020 International Charities Pre-Briefing Book**

The content of the Pre-Briefing Books was compiled from the information the charities provided on their funding application. For each charity you could find the focus group, target number, a summary of the project and the amount of money requested.

The Charity Vote was blind. For that reason, we have now put together the Briefing Books with project names and pictures.

Currently there are two amounts for each charity: “Total Project Cost” and “Amount Possible to Fund”. In December, the NCB Board will meet after all funds have been received and the “Donated Amount” will be added to each charity. You will see that sometimes the “Donated Amount” is different from the “Amount Possible to Fund”. If, in reviewing the itemized budget of the project, we see that we can donate a smaller amount than requested and still fund an integral part of the project, we propose the smaller amount.

Each charity was notified in September after the voting by the National Representatives, via email, of a “Possible to Fund” letter. It is our sincere hope that the efforts of the NCB and National Teams will give us the ability to fund every project, at least partially. **In the event that we cannot support every project, the amounts will be disbursed to both the Belgian and International Charities in their ranked order.** If a charity does not receive funds from this year’s bazaar, they are welcome to reapply, with the same or a new project, next year.

### This year we conducted our voting via Survey Monkey

A sample of what it looked like is below. Essentially, the voting process remained the same from previous years. Each National Representative ranked all of the charities: 1-25 for International, and 1-10 for Belgian in order of priority. A number 1 was the highest priority project and a number 25 (International) or 10 (Belgian) was the lowest priority project.

Below you will see an example of how the Belgian Charity Voting List appeared.

### **Mission and Project Summary:**

The Czech Republic records each year 2,500 children who suffer from severe psychological consequence of domestic violence (DN). Consequently, LOCIKA struggles with constant client overflow. Due to limited capacity, the organization is forced to leave many traumatized children without timely help. Increased number of contracted therapy sessions and appropriately equipped therapy rooms will, in 2021, help give 300 children (12 % of minor victims of DN in the country). The Therapeutic and counselling support provided is led by innovative method of work with entire family unit, including both parents (including the aggressor). Services are designed to help stop violence in the family and enable the child to cope with its impacts. opportunity to cope with impacts of violence and chance for violence-free childhood.

When children come to the Centre, they are psychically and physically weak and unstable. Our work is to help them with all the ways – with professional specialists, support, with our kindness and providing different therapy’s and activities that can help them with physical and emotional health. In this project we want to build a new outdoor “Classroom” – wooden canopy. Place where teachers will organize different kind of activities. The old one has a bad condition and it`s not safe anymore. Time in a fresh air is very important part of rehabilitation. In addition, this will be storage for toys, equipment and baby carriages.

Goal is to restore self-confidence to girls, who experience stress because of hair loss with natural wigs. To present to them that they can overcome and solve their problems. About 20 girls need these wigs, so we need to make 20 wigs in the Wig and Hair Master Wig Shop. The wigs will be given to the girls for use and returned to us after that, so another child uses them too. They already have a memorandum of cooperation with Wig and Hair Master in Belgrade.

The phone and on-line Help Line will be fully operational to provide information, initial psychological support, and referral if necessary. All activities will be promoted on “Novi put” web page and social platforms and awareness of minimum 5000 people will be raised through informative materials distributed in grass-root campaigns

They will carry out a deep reconstruction of the six classes and provide the bathrooms with drinking water.

The aim of the project is to support the motor education program with the most diverse equipment to apply the method of sensory and motor development to these children in need. These equipment's will allow the integration of primitive reflexes, vestibular, proprioceptive, psychomotor stimulation of children with special needs.

### **Mission and Project Summary:**

Infusion therapy or intravenous (IV) therapy is the delivery of drugs, antibiotics, nutrients and other fluids into the bloodstream via a catheter. An infusion pump is an important component of this delivery system. At least 80% of hospital patients receive some sort of IV therapy throughout their hospital care. In our hospital this IV therapy is delivered mostly manually. The infusion pumps offer significant advantages over manual administration, including the ability to deliver fluids in very small volumes and at precisely programmed rates and/or automated intervals. Each pump costs €1.000

The stay of children in the institution is temporary, so that the Centres for Social Work have sufficient time to adequately address the children for their further growth and development. Children come from hospitals to the Centre Duga immediately after birth or from their abused families.

### **Mission and Project Summary:**

The main essence of the project is to equip a sensor-dynamic hall with a set of special hanging shells for classes using the method of sensory integration and other correctional and developing technologies, since there is not a center in Semey equipped with special sensor equipment. Sensory-dynamic hall is a unique space where a child learns his inner and surrounding world through movement. Motor sensitivity activates the stimulation of skin receptors, from which impulses about new experiences come into the brain. Skin sensitivity contributes to the appearance of various emotions. The emphasis is on the integration of vestibular, proprioceptive and tactile sensations, and not just on motor reactions. In the sensory-dynamic hall, children will engage with sensory integration specialists every day for 40 minutes.

The young volunteers learn how to cook and meet new friends, as they prepare the meals. And the sick families have received more than 7,500 meals in the last year. That's why we want to open another kitchen. This time in the city of Aalborg, in the north of Denmark. The families with serious illness receive the finished meals to all members of the family. For four days a week for eight weeks at no charge. And the nice dishes are a huge help in an everyday life filled with pain and worry.

Boccia is a target sport played indoors with soft leather balls aimed at athlete with high support needs. The budget consists of the costs of the purchase and delivery of sports equipment, rental of a gym and payment of the trainer's salary.

In this project, these two activities will be combined. Children with no disabilities will be involved in the therapeutic riding activities as helpers of their peers with disabilities. In order for the project to be possible, investments are needed for the maintenance and upgrading of stables, riding trails and riding equipment. The expected impacts of the proposed project are: development of social skills of children from both groups, improvement of the health of children with disabilities and the development of a culture of volunteering in those with no disabilities.

‘Perinatální hospic Dítě v srdci’ **Baby in Heart** provides perinatal palliative care to families who face either expected or sudden loss of their baby during pregnancy, childbirth or shortly after. Child death, especially the death of newborns and miscarriage, is a great social taboo. Families are traumatized by the loss itself but also by the lack of understanding of the community around. Memory Box is a tool to promote healthy mourning, its use can activate parenting competences in times of great shock and numbness.

The next phase of the capital works is to create a multi-use auditorium and fully equipped kitchen, which will provide a dining hall, additional classroom capacity, an expanded curriculum and better learning resources so we can admit more children to the school. It will also provide space for community and cultural events that will enable Larchfield to engage with the wider community.

### **Mission and Project Summary:**

A partial budget for the construction of the building carcass and the roof of the first part of the girls' hostel which is room 1, 2, 9, 10, and 10 showers and sinks. (In this area of Africa, it is common that building projects last many years and that funding of such a project is a patchwork of local contributions and NGO. The fact that the community already has bricks, bought land, and collected stones for foundation shows the dedication of the community. Girls hostel will be located next to the secondary school and would help ease the pressure and reduce girl's dropout rates.

Our goal is to finance one school year for them-during which we reach 4 x's 16 classes, which is about 1600 children per school year. We would also financially help 12 parents raising disabled children.
